It's not a snapshot of one day, but 90 days. I can behave myself and eat really healthy for a few days before blood work, but if I would do it for 90 I probably wouldn't need the bloodwork. On the other hand, knowing that my good days will even out the bad ones is comforting. There is a bit of grace there.

Thank goodness, I get that grace daily. My Chirisian walk is good, but at any given time, it may look better or worse than the average. There are days that I am caught up on my personal study, had sufficient time for prayer, and have taken some Sabbath time in the recent past. I feel like l'm doing good. And then there are the other days. I am way behind in my study, my prayer life is just quick, scattered prayers, and I can't tell you the last time I had Sabbath rest. The good seems to help carry me through the bad.

Either way, I know that God's grace is there. I know that my relationship grows deeper in the good times, and God will be waiting for me when I get my ducks in a row after a bad time. "Amazing grace! how sweet the sound, That saved a wretch; like me." It really is Amazing Grace, always there, never wavering, ready to meet me when I need it most. I may have gotten a little grace with my lab work, even after all the Christmas goodies, it was pretty good. Thank you for Amazing Grace.

## What's Happening in a Glance



Hello, friends. Stuck. Stuck. Stuck. Sometimes, we all feel stuck. Stuck in a rut; stuck in a mess; stuck in a thought; stuck in a choice. Our story this month is about two guys who were stuck. They made choices in life that brought them to a pretty bad spot where they were stuck. They were on either side of Jesus, three men hanging on crosses, but only one who chose to be there. Two thieves who chose to break the law were there with a King who chose to be stuck right there between them. One thief recognized Jesus was not there for having done anything wrong. He spoke to Jesus and Jesus saw him. He asked Jesus to remember him when He went into heaven. Of all the time and places that Jesus could have shown up, He chose to be there right then to meet this man. The last great act that Jesus did before He died was to offer a chance for this man to be with Him in paradise. There are no accidents with God. He does not put people "in our way;" He puts people "in our path." We will get stuck some days but it might be because God needs us to slow down so we can meet someone along our path. We meet people who need us to offer comfort, to sit with them in struggles and to introduce them to a mighty Savior who loves them right where they are; but, we also meet people who we need to encourage us, to help us, to support us, to love us and to help guide us on our faith journey. Our attitude matters along the way. Do we notice the folks struggling on either side of us? Do we take time to "see" them and extend hope, comfort, love, encouragement, grace? Or, do we see them "in our way" and try to get around them as fast as we can? Jesus chooses to get stuck with us. He sees us and He has what we need to get unstuck from the past and to get stuck with Him for the future. He is so patient
 and steady. He is authentic and real. He knows who we are, what we have done and how stuck we are and He invites us to join Him anyway. True disciples take time to see with Christ's eyes, feel with Christ's heart, and listen with Christ's ears. They choose to get stuck, too. Maybe being stuck isn't so bad, especially, if we get stuck with a friend and, even better, if it is with a friend we didn't know we needed until we got stuck together. You have a friend in Jesus. Go get stuck.

## United Methodist General Conference Information Sessions

The United Methodist worldwide General Conference will be held April 23 - May 3, 2024 in Charlotte, North Carolina. This is the General Conference that has been postponed since 2020 due to the Covid Pandemic, and issues with hundreds of visas of the delegates.

The coming General Conference is to have 862 voting delegates - $55.9 \%$ from the U.S., $32 \%$ from Africa, $6 \%$ from the Philippines, $4.6 \%$ from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. There are at least 10 different languages spoken among delegates, and roughly 1,100 pieces of legislation to work through. Half of the delegates are to be clergy and half laity. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions, but do not have a vote. Trinity's own, Chris Lynch, is a lay delegate to General Conference.

We will hold three information sessions leading up to the General Conference on the first Sunday of each month beginning in February. I have asked Rev. Jim Brookshire to lead us in these sessions. Jim is a retired UM elder from the Western NC Conference, and is an active "member" of Trinity (clergy are technically members of annual conferences, not local churches).

## All three sessions will be held in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday afternoons at 4 pm on February 4, March 3, and April 7.

February 4 @ 4pm - How We Got Here?
March 3 @ 4pm - Legislation Before General Conference
April 7 @ 4pm - What does it mean for the local church? For Trinity UMC Anderson?
