## Ramblings from Rev. Roy

By the time you read this we will be well into the Lenten season and heading quickly to Holy Week, and then Easter at the end of the month!

Of course, Easter is all about the Resurrection, new life in Christ, and the hope that it brings. But first, we must prepare our hearts, minds, and lives. It's time for some deep spring cleaning (or shall I say Lenten cleaning). As stated previously.....

The Season of Lent is a time of self-reflection and spiritual examination. It is a time for getting our spiritual house in order so to speak....but above all, it is an invitation to once again commit to love like Christ loves.

Jesus' initial preaching is summed up in the verse, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand" (Matthew 3:2; Mark 1:15).

The word "repent" doesn't exactly mean what we tend to think of today. "Repent" (or *metanoia* in Greek) simply means **to change**. So the initial preaching of Jesus invites us to be willing to change - change our hearts and minds so that we are committed to loving like Jesus - change our lives around so that we love not only in word and speech, but also in action.

That is our task during this time of Lent - to prepare for Easter ......so that we can change and be Resurrection people.

And besides the mighty task of preparing our individual hearts, minds, and lives (as if that wasn't enough) - we must also prepare our church for Easter Sunday (the highest attendance Sunday of the year generally).

We all want Trinity UMC to be at its best. As I contemplated what that means for us, I recognized four main focus areas (I'm sure there's more). To be clear, these are things I think Trinity already does, but just as we intentionally prepare our hearts during this time, we also want to be intentional with preparing our church. It is good to be reminded of our tasks. So to be what God intends for us to be, we want Trinity UMC to:

### 1. BE AN INVITING CONGREGATION.

Invite your family members, neighbors, friends and strangers to come and celebrate the Resurrection with us.

#### 2. BE A WELCOMING CONGREGATION.

Make sure everyone feels greeted and new folks know where to go, where the restrooms are located, and the nursery, etc. Make sure to include people who may be unfamiliar with the traditions of our church, or perhaps Christian worship all together.

### 3. BE AN AUTHENTIC CONGREGATION.

You love your church. Allow folks to see that genuine and real love for one another. Laughter, smiles, enthusiasm and positivity are all contagious. Let's be contagious (in a good way).

#### 4. BE A MISSIONAL CONGREGATION.

Know our vision and mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" by "loving God and all people, learning God's will and ways, and living for Christ in the world." Share stories of how Trinity is accomplishing this, and invite our guests to join us in our mission.

These are our tasks - not just for Lent, but for each and every day. We are to live like the "kingdom of God is at hand." We are to be people of hope and light. We are to be Resurrection people. We are to be a Resurrection church. Easter is coming - let's get ready!

## Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn

Last weekend, I had the honor to worship and read Scripture at Trinity UMC in Charleston SC. Not only were we welcomed with open arms, but I was also shocked when the pastor offered for me to help with the service. Trinity UMC Charleston was built in 1791. It is a beautiful church, painted in a soft blue with white trim. It has a pipe organ in the back of the balcony that was obviously designed for beauty as well as its sound. I was so honored to read Scripture in a



place that has heard the word of God for over 200 years. As I sat in one of the chairs behind the pulpit, I couldn't help but marvel at the place. When I looked in the pulpit, it was a bit different. While neat and tidy, it showed the work that takes place. Those gathered to worship saw the beauty of the church. From behind the pulpit, I could see the sound equipment, the oil for the candles and the offering plates waiting to be used. This is the other side of what we do.

As Christians, we sometimes think we need to show the peace and the wonders that following Jesus allows us to enjoy but the reality is that behind the façade we put forth, we have to do the work. We have to make sure we are connected to God in prayer, we have to be in the Scriptures and we have to work to make sure that we do not fall into temptation. It's not always the face we show the world. Being a Christian doesn't make our lives easier; it means we work toward different goals. And yes, work is required. Might we offer the world a different perspective if we show the other side? Might we be more open and honest if we allow others to see that we still have work to do on ourselves?

I am not sure what side I always show. I have shared times of struggle with other Christians but have I allowed others to see that it is not always easy. Jesus, while fully divine, allowed his humanness to show at times. He lost his temper, he cried, and he laughed. Maybe I need to allow the world to see that, Yes I am a Christian saved by grace but I still have to do the work to enjoy a life lived in Christ.



# March Edition What's Happening in a Glance



Hello, friends. Lent is here, a time for reflection and preparation. Our monthly lesson for our KIDS this month is the Easter story as told in all four Gospels. When God repeats Himself, we should definitely pay attention. Each of the first four books of the New Testament include the telling of the Easter story. Even though there are a few differences in each, that is actually stronger evidence that the stories are true. Any group of witnesses would retell an event slightly differently because the accounting is from different view points, recalling details that stood out from different perspectives. It makes the story more believable and very reliable. The disciples were on an emotional roller coaster ride - great excitement followed by devastating events, confusion about what had just happened and what was going to happen, betrayal of a friend who sold out another friend, hopelessness, fear and exhaustion that comes after an adrenaline crash. What a wild week for sure! But, God wasn't done yet. When hope seemed lost and death was overshadowing life, God did not disappoint. Like the best made Hollywood blockbuster film, it wasn't over when they thought it was over. Grab your popcorn and big gulp slushy because it is about to get Emmy worthy! Rising from the rubble of shattered hopes and dreams, our Hero is not down. He is just getting started. Each of the four Gospels gives a slightly different take on the Easter morning events but together, they make a very beautiful picture of hope out of despair and light out of darkness. Director's cut, special behind the scenes, 3-D version - same script, different angles. A glimpse of Jesus and a soft word of 'I am here' to



reassure His friends that it was not over; it is just the beginning. Moments in our lives can be overwhelming, hard to process, challenging to breathe through, unexpected and chaotic, but those are the moments that Jesus can appear, speak a soft word and reset the mindset. Cue the music, get excited, sit up at the edge of your seat and prepare for the best comeback of all time! He is risen... He is risen indeed!


Thank you, Trinity, for your love and support all these years. Hope I have given something in return. Love to you!

## Facilities / Campus Report March 2024

The past few months have given us off and on extremely colder than normal weather for our area. Many of those cold days happened on the weekend which placed extra strain on our heat systems trying to satisfy our demands. Last month, we experienced a pump and valve failure on the 2007 installed boiler network that feeds the sanctuary. Shipping backlogs created delays longer than expected before all repairs were made. When our heat system failed in the sanctuary last month, we quickly moved all services into the Fellowship Hall with tremendous support from our worship teams. With warmer weather projected this month, our heat usage will decrease with needed savings on utility cost and equipment usage.

We installed (2) new ADA approved door handles at Asbury Hall which will make entering much easier for everyone. We serviced and adjusted other locks and panic bar doors around our campus for proper operations.

Our downspout drain system was camera inspected after noticing rain water drain backups during very heavy rainfall. We had the lines high pressure water jetted to free the blockage of roots, leaves, and asphalt gravel. The drain line near our education building is now clean with clear video footage showing direction of flow pattern away from the building.

## <u>United Methodist General Conference</u> Information Sessions

The United Methodist worldwide General Conference will be held April 23 - May 3, 2024 in Charlotte, North Carolina. This is the General Conference that has been postponed since 2020 due to the Covid Pandemic, and issues with hundreds of visas of the delegates.

The coming General Conference is to have 862 voting delegates — 55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. There are at least 10 different languages spoken among delegates, and roughly 1,100 pieces of legislation to work through. Half of the delegates are to be clergy and half laity. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions but do not have a vote. **Trinity's own, Chris Lynch, is a lay delegate to General Conference.** 

We will hold two more information sessions leading up to the General Conference on the first Sunday of March and April. Rev. Jim Brookshire is leading us in these sessions. Jim is a retired UM elder from the Western NC Conference, and is an active "member" of Trinity (clergy are technically members of annual conferences, not local churches). Our first session held in February was well attended and ended in powerful prayer together.

Our remaining sessions will be in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday afternoons at 4pm on March 3rd and April 7th. We will also have a special service of prayer on Sunday, April 21 (prior to the start of General Conference).
