The Big Rocks

There's a well-known story about a university professor that wanted to make a point about the importance of priorities.

The professor stood in front of his class with a display of items, he took a large empty jar and filled it with rocks approximately two inches in diameter. He then asked the class if the jar was full and they agreed yes the jar was full.

The professor then took a box of pebbles and added them to the jarand then took a box of sand and added it to the jar, filling the spaces between the rocks and the pebbles.

This jar represents life. The big rocks signify the really important things in your life; the pebbles are the other things that matter in your life; and the sand signifies the remaining small stuff.

So I was reminded today to stay focused on the Big Rocks! Or else there is no room for what matters most if you fill the jar with pebbles and sand first.

Of course, when Jesus was asked about the "Big Rocks" - the most important of the commandments, we know his answer: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength ...and Love your Neighbor as Yourself".

John Wesley, one of the founders of Methodism, named some "Big Rocks" for the people called Methodists - he called them the *Three Simple Rules*:

#1 - Do No Harm

#2- Do Good

#3 - Stay in Love with God ("attain to the ordinances of God")

Here at Trinity UMC, we have "Big Rocks" known as our vision and mission: "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" by "loving God and all people, learning God's will and ways, and living for Christ in the world."

And last month I named a few other "Big Rocks" that I see in the jar:

- 1. BE AN INVITING CONGREGATION.
- 2. BE A WELCOMING CONGREGATION.
- 3. BE AN AUTHENTIC CONGREGATION.
- 4. BE A MISSIONAL CONGREGATION.

All these are our "Big Rocks" and we put them in the glass jar first - they are our priorities. "For God alone.....is [our] rock and [our] salvation" (Psalm 62: 5-6), and Jesus Christ is "the cornerstone" (I Peter 2: 4-6).

I give thanks for all you do and for who you are - Children of God and Brothers and Sisters in Christ! You rock! Together we are #TrinityStrong.

Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn

As I am writing this it is before Easter, by the time you read it, it may be after Easter. We find ourselves in an in between time, a time of waiting. It makes me think of Holy Saturday. We remember Maundy Thursday, and celebrate the Last Supper. It is a day to remember Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial. Good Friday we remember the ultimate sacrifice as our Savior willingly died on a cross for our sins, so that we could be forgiven. Then we get to Holy Saturday. Nothing of note happens, so we just wait for Easter Sunday. But I think there is something



special about Holy Saturday, about a day without any events to celebrate except the wait.

Henri Nouwen tells us," Of all the days in history, Holy Saturday – the Saturday during which the body of Jesus lay in the tomb in silence and darkness behind the large stone that was rolled against its entrance, (Mark 15:46) - is the day of God's solitude. It is the day on which the whole creation waits in deep inner rest." Genesis tells us that God created and on the seventh day God rested. Jesus came to us, shared the Good News and was buried on day six of Holy Week. Now all of creation is to rest. We are to rest and wait as all of creation prepares to meet the Risen Christ the next day.

So if you read this before Holy Saturday, I challenge you to find a time of rest, a time to sit and wait as you prepare your hearts for Easter. If you are reading this after Holy Saturday, you can still find time to rest. We need our rest. Christ's resurrection on Easter is the beginning. It is the day we are called to go and share the love of the Risen Christ. Take time to rest this Holy Saturday because Easter Sunday we get to work!

Key Passage:

I have spoken to you about earthly things, and you do not believe. So how will you believe if I speak about heavenly things? - John 3:12

Hello, friends. Springtime brings all kinds of fresh new life, from fuzzy bunnies hopping around to birds chirping in nests to plants and flowers poking up through the dirt. We see life springing up all around us. The yellow coating on all of the vehicles is a reminder that with the new stuff spring brings, pollen happens, too. The bees may be excited but my sinuses are not. Sneezing, itchy watery eyes and a sinus headache are sure to arrive—labor pains for all the new life awakening around us. A man named Nicodemus was intrigued by some of Jesus' teachings. He snuck away at night to meet up with Jesus and ask a few questions to try to understand what it means to be "born again." Jesus gives Nicodemus an explanation but it is still a little hard for him to comprehend. How can someone be born a second time? That is physically impossible. Jesus responds that the new life is different from the physical birth. It is a renewing of the spirit. The Holy Spirit works in us always but there are seasons in our faith life. There are times that feel like fall: I see the beauty of the changing leaves but I also recognize that the warmth of summer is behind me and the cold winter is coming. There is not much growth during these times. But then, the springtime comes and I feel warmed by the Spirit and excited for all of the new things growing around me. Some faith winters are especially hard - ice storms and gray skies; some are not bad at all - ski trips and fireplaces with cocoa in hand. The Spirit is always with us, guiding us, encouraging us, empowering us to hang in there until the spring. We receive this gift of the Spirit as a parting gift from Jesus. He tells us that He must go, but He is not leaving



us alone. The Holy Spirit connects us to God the Father, Jesus the Son and to each other. As you watch life opening up in the physical world, think about the beauty blooming in your spiritual life. Every flower, plant, bunny, bird or bee is a gentle reminder from God that He is still with us, life is still happening and it is beautiful and wonderful to behold. Try to remember this month to stop and smell the flowers - Achoo!

The coming General Conference is to have 862 voting delegates — 55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. There are at least 10 different languages spoken among delegates, and roughly 1,100 pieces of legislation to work through. Half of the delegates are to be clergy and half laity. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions but do not have a vote. **Trinity's own, Chris Lynch, is a lay delegate to General Conference.**

We continue and continually pray for Trinity UMC and our city of Anderson. And we continue to remain focused on our mission of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" by "loving God and all people, learning God's will and ways, and living for Christ in the world."
