Ramblings from Rev. Roy

Everyone knows that Valentine's Day is February 14th. It is the day for love. But did you know that one of our main purposes as a church is "to watch over one another in love?"

In the preface to the General Rules (do no harm, do good, stay in love with God), John Wesley, founder of Methodism, described the Methodist societies:

"Such a society is no other than 'a company of [persons] having the form and seeking the power of godliness, united in order to pray together, to receive the word of exhortation, and **to watch over one another in love......**"

Wesley believed the Christian life is a pilgrimage or journey toward holiness of heart and life. While deeply personal, the pilgrims never make the journey alone. We travel together.

From our Sunday School classes, LifeGroups, youth group, choir, band, visitation team, card ministry team, prayer group, bible studies, women's group, and others - we travel together and are "to watch over one another in love". I know that we do not do this perfectly but I have witnessed many cases at Trinity that it is done well. And I give thanks for the opportunity to travel with you.

In our current study, "Knowing Who We Are: The Wesleyan Way of Grace", it lists two scriptures that Wesley often used in connection with "watching over one another in love." I wanted to share them with you (for those who have not been able to be in our study).

Ephesians 4: 32 Be kind, compassionate, and forgiving to each other, in the same way God forgave you in Christ.

Colossians 3: 12 Therefore, as God's choice, holy and loved, put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. 13 Be tolerant with each other and, if someone has a complaint against anyone, forgive each other. As the Lord forgave you, so also forgive each other.

February 14th may be Valentine's Day - a day for love. But as United Methodists, every single day is a day to "watch over one another in love" as we journey toward holiness of heart and life. Thanks be to God for the journey, and that we travel together.

Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn

I have seen a lot of things on my trip to Costa Rica. I have seen the amazing beauty of God's creation, more shades of green than I knew existed. I have seen a level of poverty that I could not have even imagined. I have seen an equal level of gratitude for a bag of food that only held the barest essentials. I have watched friendships bloom even when they struggled with the language barrier. I have seen the Spirit move through unexpected paths to bring God glory.

I have felt many things as well. I felt the warm sun and enjoyed a cool drink. I have felt the rain and the humidity. I felt a welcomed breeze on a hot day. Saturday, I got to feel the waves of the ocean. More than anything I have felt God's love through hugs, food, and time with friends, new and old.

I have felt and seen God's love in very powerful ways. To worship and not understand the words but fully feel the Spirit. Time to fully worship and not worry about anything else. To communicate God's love without words, but through actions, smiles and laughs. I know very little Spanish, most of those we met in Costa Rica know more English than I do Spanish yet we shared God's love. We shared it in many varied and powerful ways.

It can be easy to share stories from trips like these, but I find that the best parts are so hard to describe. One of the verses that was shared in a devotion with the women in the afternoon has really stuck with me. Ephesians 4:1-6 says: "I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all." Our differences do not matter, we worship one God, we are all of one body and Spirit, we share one faith and one baptism.

As I adjust to living in Anderson again, my prayer for myself is that I make every effort to continue to live that way. That my actions and words continue to say, "we are all part of one body, one Spirit and one Lord. We love each other because we are one in Christ. May we work together in that way in all we do."

Rebuild Upstate's approach to affordable housing differs slightly from other affordable housing organizations, in that they don't offer total new home construction or provide affordable rental housing. Instead, they focus solely on home preservation and repair as means to keep residents in their own homes.

By understanding the needs of the people inside a home, they gain a better insight to the repairs that will help them the most. Whether addressing safe entry and exit by building a new wheelchair ramp or ensuring that a family is healthy and dry under a new roof, the goal of every home repair is to make sure the residents may remain comfortably in place for years to come. That's why Rebuild Upstate takes a holistic approach to affordable housing by partnering with other fantastic community organizations to help address the symptoms of subpar housing and empower individuals to break the cycle of poverty.

February Edition What's Happening in a Glance



This month, our KIDS ministry will be looking at the Hello. friends. parable of the lost sheep. Of all the fluffy animals that we could be compared to, Jesus uses the sheep. They are not the smartest animals on the planet and they tend to get in trouble if they do not have a shepherd watching over them. So, maybe the metaphor tracks pretty well. We do not always make the best decisions, do the right thing, go the right direction or trust the right people. But God is never far from us. If we follow the Shepherd and trust that He is looking out for our best interests, we will be okay. He will help navigate us home when we are lost. In keeping with our candy theme this year, our kids will be doing experiments with candy canes (the shepherd's crook). They will be making lost sheep I-Spy bottles. They will make some fluffy sheep snacks and learn a little fluffy sheep science, too. Although this story is a very familiar one, every time we talk about it with the kids, we notice something new or learn something new about each other. Sheep know the voice of the shepherd. Do we? If God speaks to me, do I recognize His voice above the noise of life? Do I respond to His voice the way the sheep respond to the shepherd? My family recently went

to an animal safari place in Georgia. Those animals knew the voice of the tour guide who drove us through the enclosure. They responded when he spoke but not when our family did. They knew *his* voice. I hope that I can also get to a place that when God speaks, I recognize Him without question and immediately respond. Some days, I get it right; other days, I do not. But, I keep getting new opportunities to learn and listen to Jesus as He walks with us (His sheep).

Valentine's Dinner Fundraiser February 8th (5:00 - 7:00 PM) Lasagna, Salad, Garlic Bread and Dessert



Lenten Study


Please join us for our Lenten Study beginning March 2 at 3 pm in Asbury Hall.

Trinity Transformation Tales

There are so many things that come to mind when I hear the word Transformation. To choose one thing or one experience with Trinity that resonates transformation is too difficult.

I wondered, should I talk about the transformation of my family in 2006 when we attended Trinity as new transplants to Anderson and it felt like we were home? We started attending when Pastor Frey started here and I had just lost my father. I was in a new town, at a new church and yet, somehow, Trinity felt so warm and comfortable. I watched my kids experience youth retreats that I never experienced growing up. My youngest son found a crew to hang out with and he loved going to youth. He struggled when we moved here and with the loss of my dad, more than my other kids did. What was so special about Trinity that he felt comfortable here?

Should I talk about the laughs and friends I made going on women's retreats and having lunch with ladies who were not too uptight to laugh at themselves? This was different kind of "church folk" to me. Church had been more serious growing up and it was really nice to feel the joy of the Lord in stories about kids and spouses and life. We bonded over struggles with laughter.

Should I talk about the Salkehatchie retreats that my youngest daughter loved going on and how much the experience with our youth group there gave her confidence in her ability to do anything? She and Eva Welborn have some stories. She wanted to go back every year and watch her friends (and new friends) change a home and a life with love, sweat, and a hammer.

Should I talk about the support that I felt when I mourned the loss of a marriage and found my footing as a single mom trying to navigate a new role at an older age? I had never felt so loved by a church body in my life. Cards, hugs, smiles and casseroles shouted "I love you" from a God who knew I needed Trinity before I even got to that chapter in my life. I am so grateful He did.

Should I talk about the welcoming hearts that embraced my new love and greeted him with handshakes and hugs and coffee? We dressed in costumes for the Journey and he stepped out of his comfort zone because this congregation made him feel just as comfortable in theirs. I married that amazing man in the Sanctuary surrounded by love. Trinity watched us step down the aisle and then we watched my husband step down into Lake Hartwell to get baptized at one of our church picnics. I felt the peace of God and the love of our community surrounding us that day, too.

Should I talk about the excitement of my granddaughter, Anslee, as she has started to feel the same way about Trinity that I do - welcomed and at home. She talks too much and moves too fast and she loves everybody she meets. She has grown from a place of "I am not sure about God" to "When can I get baptized? Can I pray at Wednesday night supper? Are you picking me up to spend the night on Saturday so I can see my friends and go to church on Sunday?" She loves it here. Her little brother is starting to, too.

Should I talk about the Trinity Preschool and how three of my grandkids learn about community and ABC's while feeling at home in the 3's class with amazing teachers and tons of friends? They cried the first day they attended preschool here not because they were ready to go home, but because they were sad at the end of the day that it was over. In the midst of a move and a few other major changes, they felt safe and happy here in this space. They felt loved.
