Ramblings from Rev. Roy

John and Charles Wesley's "Holy Club" began in 1729 at Oxford University. That organization is the root of Methodism, making it the only denomination that began out of a university setting. The Holy Club members gathered three or four evenings a week to study the Bible and the Classics, take food to poor families, visit the lonely in prison, and teach orphans how to read.

In their daily private devotions, they developed 22 questions to ask themselves about their own discipleship. I wonder how you and I might change (or be transformed) if we were to ask ourselves these questions daily??

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give it time to speak to me everyday?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
- 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?
- 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly?
- 22. Is Christ real to me?

I have come to understand that collecting fabric and sewing fabric are two different hobbies.

May Edition What's Happening in a Glance



Hello, friends. This month, our KIDS ministry will be looking at the story of Mary and Martha. For a young person in faith, this can be a tricky story - on one hand, Jesus tells us to serve; on the other hand, He reminds Martha that she needs to stop to enjoy the guest, too. For young people, this may look like a great excuse to not clean up rooms or help serve meals when family comes to visit. And, yes, it means that kind of, but so much more. We get busy doing the work sometimes and we forget to just pause and enjoy our time with Jesus. He may not be physically sitting on the couch in our living rooms, but He is very much here with us. Honor Him when you are serving and doing the work, but then, find time to pause and just hang out with Him, too. This is a weird idea for some of us, to spend time with someone we cannot see. Practice makes perfect (or at least, practice makes less awkward). May is Mental Health Awareness Month

The Anderson County Office of the Coroner issued a report in April of this year reporting that Anderson County has seen a 300% increase in suicides compared to the first quarter of last year. From January to March of 2024 there were 8 suicides and that same time period this year there were 24. Ages ranged from 18 to 75 years old. (Payton 2025)

There are many reasons why someone feels that suicide is the only option and many of us will never understand that level of desperation. Yet many of us may struggle with poor mental health at times. While most Americans understand that mental health issues come from a chemical imbalance in the brain, there is still a stigma around mental health issues (NAMI 2016). "Conservative Christians may turn to religious support, often citing sin and a lack of self-control as the root of mental illness. This perspective can sometimes create a reluctance to seek professional help, but many still find comfort in their faith" (Hlongwane and Juby 2023). Struggling with mental health issues is not a sign of a lack of faith or a lack of prayer, it is a medical condition that needs treatment just like high blood pressure or diabetes.

Our faith can help us when we struggle, but incorrect teachings can also add to the struggle. Our goal is to help spread awareness so that everyone knows that help is available. While our Stephen Ministers are not trained to offer counseling for ongoing mental health struggles, as a Stephen Leader, I can help point you in the right direction to find the help you need. Special Called Church Conference Results

The special called Church Conference for the purpose of voting upon the Trustees recommendation of the future sale of the parsonage took place on Sunday, April 13 at 4pm. The District Superintendent led the meeting, and paper ballots were used. The vote was 31-17 in favor of selling the parsonage at the next senior pastor transition. The Mitchell family will stay in the parsonage for as long as this appointment lasts.

There were two additional requirements added for when that time comes in the future.

- 1. The standing District Superintendent will need to give his/her approval.
- 2. The Trustee Board and Church Administrative Council (current at the time) will need to give approval on the price on which to sell.

Invested money from the parsonage sell to help provide the housing allowance for our pastor moving forward. We expect this action to better serve our church financially while allowing our future pastor the choice of different housing that best suits them, various school locations, rental options, homeownership or property investments.

Your continued prayer, support and suggestions are deeply appreciated as we address property management and ministry responsibilities at Trinity UMC.
