Even though this woman in our story was not living a life that was considered a "clean" life, Jesus saw value in her under the dirt. He blessed her for blessing Him and told her to go in peace. We cannot determine the true value of a stranger. It is only in the relationship that we can truly see the value of the folks around us. Talent is not based on wealth or stature. Beauty is not skin deep. If you do not know how special you are go to Jesus and let Him reveal your worth in a new and exciting way. Go in peace.



We have replaced the broken and dated AC system in the church kitchen thanks to a generous equipment donation from Loftis Heating & Air. This upgrade should serve us with greater comfort and better energy efficiency.

I've been working with several Commercial HVAC companies exploring the possibilities of installing proper air conditioning in the Gym. Engineers are addressing the scope of this project, codes, installation and equipment options.

We hope to have a couple option packages available for the Trustees to view before the end of summer.

As utility cost continue to rise, we should all work together with conserving energy by turning off lights in empty spaces or rooms, resetting thermostats to night settings as you leave the space and check that faucets and toilets have stopped running or turned off in our restrooms.

Together, we can continue to grow our church, offer comfortable facilities for worship and broaden our faith and fellowship with others in Christ.
