# Ramblings from Rev. Roy

6 months in review...... January - June, 2025

When driving down the highway, we must always be looking out the front windshield and seeing what is ahead of us. Paying attention to the road signs or the traffic lights, and preparing for the curves or the traffic ahead. But it is also good to glance around in the side-view and rearview mirrors on occasion just to be aware of what is behind you. Life in general, and church life too is that way I believe.

I am looking forward to all the new things coming up in the fall and next spring - new studies and opportunities abound. But let's take a moment and look back at the first six months of 2025.

Outside of worship, we studied "Knowing Who We Are: The Wesleyan Way of Grace" and "The Third Day: Living the Resurrection". Both were 6 week studies.

We sponsored and sent out 16 on a Costa Rica mission trip in January, and our youth attended "Revolution" weekend in Columbia. In February, we had a wonderful youth sponsored Valentine's Dinner, worked with Rebuild Upstate for three days to replace flooring in a home, and we had a workshop on "Marriage and Relationships" given by Epworth Counseling Center Director, Dr. Susanne Thurber. In March, we had Shrove Tuesday pancakes, Ash Wednesday service, two Emmaus Walks (men's and women's), and the Trinity Women's Spiritual Retreat in Hendersonville. In April, the children had their Easter event in the gym, and we had our Maundy Thursday service and big Easter breakfast. We also had a special Wednesday night baptism service. May was our Trinity Spring Fest and Fun Run/5k, learning and connecting with our Jewish neighbors, our Graduating Senior Recognition, and hotdogs for Memorial Day weekend service. Salkahatchie Piedmont was in June, along with a Trinity Kid's trip to the Aquarium in Atlanta.

Of course, we had Wednesday night meals, LifeGroups, The Well Youth Ministries, Young at Heart gamedays and monthly lunch outings, tutoring at Fortson Homes, etc.

We collected and donated \$6,166.00 for our monthly missions, plus 409 lbs. of food donated to Good Neighbor Cupboard and 1,532 bottles of water/gatorade donated to South Main Mercy Center.

We also received 9 new members into fellowship here at Trinity, and baptized 4 children.

The first six months of 2025 have been pretty amazing here at Trinity, and I look forward to what is ahead of us. So together, let's hear these words from the Apostle Paul in his letter to the Philippians......

**Philippians 4 -** Be glad in the Lord always! Again I say, be glad! **5** Let your gentleness show in your treatment of all people. The Lord is near. **6** Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. **7** Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus. **8** From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise. **9** Practice these things: whatever you learned, received, heard, or saw in us. The God of peace will be with you.

# Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn

As part of our vacation this summer we went tubing on the Chattahoochee River. While there were times we were together, there were also times I found myself alone and I had some time to think. Our faith walk is a lot like tubing. There are times when the river moves fast and times when it's slow. The river is faster when the water is shallow, it slows down when the water gets deep. The faster the water the more exciting it is but the slower times in deeper water is where we can really relax. There are times when our faith seems to be growing fast and things are exciting but it's when we have depth that we can sit back and rest in God.

The tubing company that we frequented offers sticks to help you down the river. I think they are a must. They can be used to move in the right direction, help get you out of trouble and be used to help others. We have many "helps" in our faith as well. Books and study can guide us in the right direction, wise mentors can help us stay out of trouble and we can share our knowledge to help others. You don't have to have a stick in the river just as you don't have to use a variety of helps to grow your faith, but they make it easier, so why say no?

While tubing, you have the option to tether yourself to your friend's tube, but they recommend no more than two. Having someone with you is fun, you are not alone and can chat all the way down the river. On our trips we occasionally encountered large groups of people tethered together. They were having a great time, I feel certain. But many times, one would make a bad decision and all of them were directly affected. One person would get stuck and then the entire group would get stuck. That is when it began to affect those around them, it was hard to navigate those large groups when things were moving fast. No one should have to walk alone, but we need to be careful of who we walk with. Sometimes we need to cut loose from those who lead us in the wrong direction and when our bad choices affect others we need to take note and make changes.

The last thing I learned is that sometimes you just get stuck. You may be stuck in a way that a small change puts you back on the go, but sometimes you have to get up and try something completely different. We can get stuck on our walk with Christ. The devotion we have used for years just isn't moving us anymore, our study topics are no longer interesting, we find that our prayer life and study time has become a chore as opposed to a joy. That's okay. Picking up and trying something new can be a great thing; no one enjoys being stuck for long.

Our faith walk, just like tubing, should be one of constant movement. Sometimes slow, sometimes fast, but we should never just stop moving. Feeling a bit stuck? That's part of my job, I would love to help you along the way. Whether it's tubing or your walk with Christ, don't stand on the side watching, come on in the waters fine!







# **Campus/Business Report for August 2025**

August represents regeneration and holds significant spiritual meaning as a time of harvest and abundance. It marks the final weeks of summer vacation for many families, preparing for a new school year, the return of normal activities at church and school. Many of you like me may be counting down the days anticipating cooler weather and the changes associated with fall.

We are continuing with our normal summer facility maintenance projects, addressing various forms of preventive maintenance within our operations to protect our investments and keep some older equipment running smoothly for as long as possible.

Over the past six months we have managed to keep our facilities clean and operational while addressing turnover and change in our Sexton- custodian department. We've rehired Jerry Norris as Sexton to bring stability back to the position, Jerry previously worked as Sexton from June 2023 – December 2024 and brings knowledge, quality care and understanding that benefits Trinity UMC, Trinity Preschool and Church Staff with his unending duties.

We completed our required Fire System inspection, upgraded some equipment within the system and Alarm network.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> floor Education Wing "Preschool" received a strip, seal and wax treatment. Those old floors will need to be replaced in the next few years. We are looking at several flooring alternatives to address this as a summer project while school is closed. Our older facility requires constant maintenance, planning and updates to operate at a level of comfort desired.

We would love to add a few additional members to our Sunday Safety Team, if you enjoy greeting people, giving helpful directions to visiting guest, offering assistance as needed and watch – report suspicious activity within our parking lot and campus, then we have a role for you! We do not act as Police officers or carry guns. The service we provide is friendly, helpful and welcoming in a Christian atmosphere. We welcome men and women above the age of 21, we have a safe location inside for distance observations for those uncomfortable working outside.
