## Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn



I have been using The Bible Recap App this year to read through Scripture for my study time. I have done it before, but thought it was time to do it again. Since I am using an app to guide me, it tells me exactly where I should be. It's great to keep me on track and find my place, but it also keeps track of when I am behind. Lately, I have gotten behind, very behind. In the past, I have tried to play catch up. Sometimes that works but this time, it has only caused more stress. Reading Scripture, diving into God's word, is supposed to be a time of Sabbath, stress is not to be a part of it. Today I found the "Catch me up button" on the app. This resets the dates so that the 1st unread day is today. Hit the button and looky there, I'm back on track. No need to feel guilty or stressed, I am where I need to be.

It's a great feature, but my need for it went one step further. My stress may have kept me from diving back in, but when I reset the timeline and read the passages for today, I read words that my soul needed to hear. I heard words that reminded me that God is with me in my sorrow, grief, stress and joy. That God knows my heart and understands why I let my daily reading slip for a bit. God understands.

God understands, maybe even more than I do. The Bible app offered me grace with the "Catch me up Button" just like God offers me grace when I just seem to fall short. I need grace daily, we all do. In those times when the overwhelming feelings seem to never go away, we need grace more than anything. What an amazing gift to know that when life seems to pull me away, God is waiting with open arms to welcome me back, meeting me right where I am. No judgement, just grace and love, which is what I need to be able to move forward.

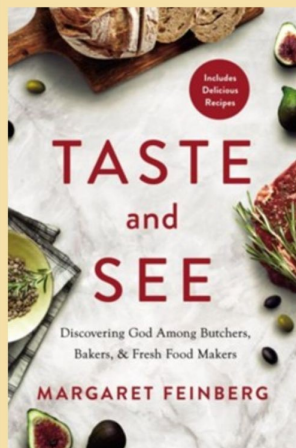


### **Disciple Fast Track 1** **Becoming Disciples Through** **Bible Study**

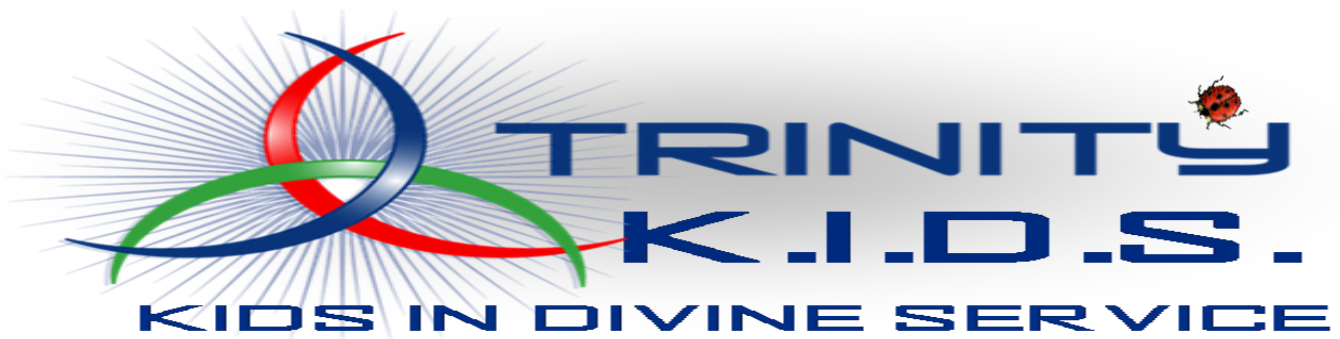

## Youth and Children Sunday Worship Service

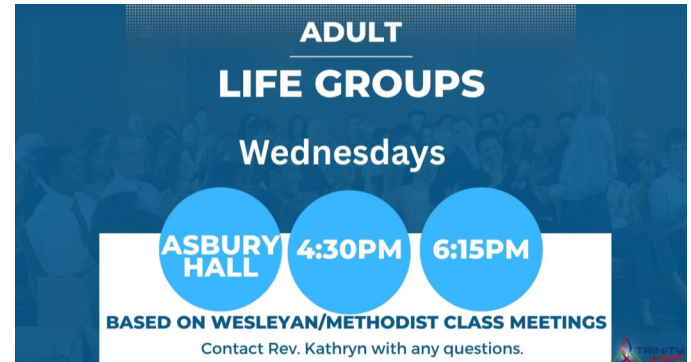
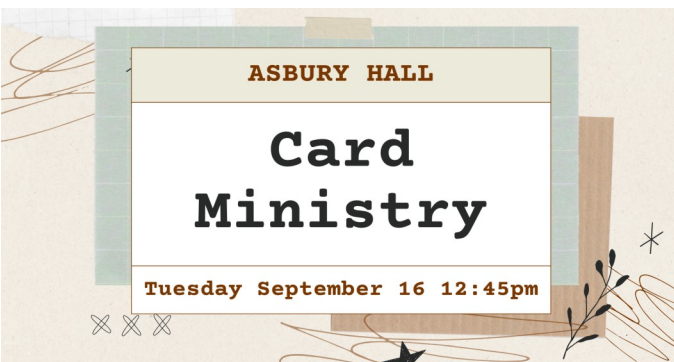
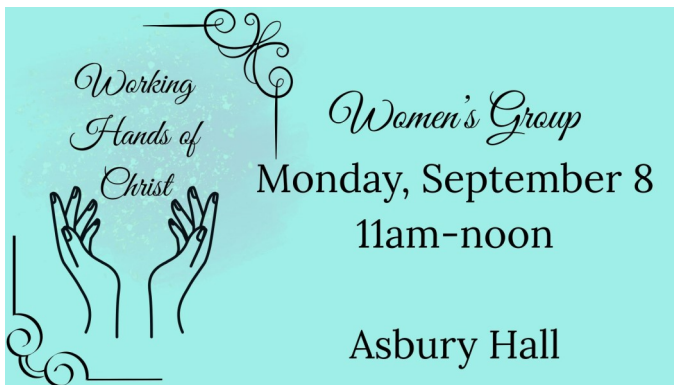

### **Journey to the Resurrection - It's Coming Back!**

Mark your calendars for March 19-22, 2026 as we bring back this Holy Week & Easter Event. The format is changing but the mission has not. Through it we will present the life of Christ as He and His Disciples experienced His last week on earth.

Two-thirds of the gym will be the Marketplace; the other third will hold the Upper Room, Garden, Courtyard, and Pilate Scenes. In these scenes, a few cast members will be talking about what they just experienced with Jesus and/or the disciples (Jesus will not be in these scenes). Guests will enter through the side gym door, spend time in the Marketplace, hear Jesus teach in the Marketplace, then move through the scenes. After the Pilate Scene, guests will move to the fellowship hall for the Crucifixion and Resurrection Scenes, followed by a brief time of prayer and reflection.

Jesus, the women who followed Him, and a few of His disciples will do the scene in the Marketplace as well as the Crucifixion and Resurrection scenes. We plan on two full dress rehearsals and may have shorter rehearsals with groups in particular scenes. There will also be meetings with instructions for singles, couples, and families who will be shopkeepers, guides, and other roles.

This format will be new to all of us but will still convey the message of God's love for us to all who attend the event.
