# Ramblings from Rev. Roy

Luke 2: 7 CEB

7 She [Mary] gave birth to her firstborn child, a son, wrapped him snugly, and laid him in a manger, because **there was no place for them in the guestroom**.

As we enter Advent and await the coming of Baby Jesus, I have been thinking about hospitality and guest experiences. The inn in Bethlehem was booked up, every room taken.

Although scripture doesn't exactly tell us whether the inn keeper went out of their way to accommodate the holy family in the stables (as I like to think), or perhaps Joseph and Mary discovered it and took it over on their own. Regardless, it is pretty safe to say that the inn was not expecting them that night. They did not have reservations.

We have probably all gone to a restaurant or a hotel without reservations to find that they were booked before we arrived. Likewise, perhaps we have gone someplace and there were not many cars in the parking lot, and everything was quiet. We wonder why, and it always feels kinda weird. Both experiences as a guest are not ideal.

For guest experiences, churches are no exceptions. Church guests want to see cars in the parking lot, but also expect to find a spot for themselves. They expect signs and other people to assist them in where to go. Many people today expect to be able to get some coffee and possibly a snack before finding a seat. And they expect a seat will be available but there will also be other people around; they are not sitting "all by themselves." Guests expect nice clean restrooms that are clearly marked and easy to find. They expect a warm greeting from each person they encounter, and a general feeling that people expected them, prepared for them, and are happy to see them.

This Advent season, not only are we anticipating the birth of Baby Jesus once again in our hearts and manger scenes, but we are expecting other guests as well. Church guests generally just show up without reservations. Perhaps they stumbled upon the building, but more often than not, they have already been to the website or perhaps have received an invitation.

All guests come with expectations and hopes of being accepted and fitting in, of finding community and faith, and experiencing meaningful worship and fellowship.

The fact is ......every single Sunday, we should be expecting guests. We should be inviting guests, and be prepared to welcome them warmly.

So what is one change we could make that would let guests know we anticipated them? How could we welcome our guests to Trinity UMC better?

Let's make a couple of rules:

- #1 The 10-ft. Rule: take responsibility for greeting anyone and everyone within 10 feet of you, especially if they are alone.
- #2 The 3-Minute Rule: spend three minutes talking with someone you don't know very well

Send me other suggestions for ways to treat our guests with hospitality. And let us all prepare our hearts to receive Christ this Christmas.....and to receive each and every guest with the love of Christ all year long.

I love nativities, I have much of my grandmother's collection and they bring beauty and happy memories to our home each Christmas. Yet, I have to wonder what we are thinking sometimes when we create them. In one set, they were all dressed beautifully, with gold accents on their clothes, not just the Three Kings but the Holy Family too. Serene looks on everyone's



face. Then I have others where everyone is standing completely still, looking like little soldiers. Then there is the one where they are all vegetables; that one came from our Veggie Tales days and obviously not realistic at all.

I know we like to portray this time as a beautiful one, but most people would not want a realistic one. It wouldn't be shiny, or have gold accents. I feel Mary and Joseph would look very tired and the kings would still be a long way away. Not to mention the chaos of the arrival of a new baby, none of this a scene we want on our mantel.

But later, maybe after a bit of a nap, I can picture Mary and Joseph looking at newborn Jesus with that sense of awe that new parents have. Maybe for just a bit, they enjoy being a new family before opening themselves up as the family of the promised Messiah. Those moments where mother and father look at their new son with all the love they have in their hearts.

That's the scene we try to capture at Christmas with our nativities. The fact that love has arrived. Not just in the love the new parents have for their child, but the love that came into the world so that we would know the love God has for us.



# Campus/Business Report for December 2025

We began January 2025 with icy weather and colder than normal conditions in our area. The church parsonage received new water and sewer lines due to extreme aging and leak issues; new fencing, gutters and roofing related to damages from Hurricane Helene in 2024 along with tree removal and cleanup.

The Board of Trustees presented a detailed request to sell the parsonage after our current pastor has completed his appointment at Trinity. The process followed the guidelines of the UMC and was approved by SPRC, Ad Council, a vote by church members and leadership from the Anderson District UMC Superintendent. Trinity UMC - Anderson chose by vote to provide our future lead pastor a housing allowance determined by SPRC guidelines.

We held an early Church Work Day in March to address overgrown tree limbs and shrubbery concerns around our campus. Another one was held in September to spread mulch as needed. #TRINITYSTRONG Springfest event provided a fun day with Kid Games, BBQ plate sale, Bake sale, 5K& Fun Run along with a Silent Auction. Loftis Heating & Air donated a new HVAC unit to replace the old system in the church kitchen.

We experienced several months of Sexton – custodian changeover with various personnel before bringing back stability with Jerry Norris to our church staff.

Our Fire Alarm and Elevator system has received inspections and maintenance as required.

We installed a new HVAC unit at our Trinity House building that had broken, this unit was on our list of equipment to upgrade during 2024 – 2028 time frame.

The Boiler that supplies our sanctuary, choir room and education building failed to start due to control and circuit board issues. Slower than normal shipping problems delayed delivering the needed parts during our first cold spell of this fall. The system has been repaired, tested and currently running normal.

Our new LED Yard Sign has been ordered with a plan of having it installed and running before Christmas. Again, this purchase was made possible by a generous donation.

I am honored to serve Trinity UMC as Business & Facilities Manager and I look forward to working with our Staff, Board of Trustees, various church committees and especially our congregation in 2026. "Let the peace of Christ rule in your heart."




Worship & Spiritual Life 24.9% (\$ 180.715.23) Every aspect of worship—both traditional and contemporary and pastoral

ages. Included in this section is funding for materials and equipment for all Sunday school classes, confirmation classes, Bible studies, family events, and Vacation Bible school. Support for our Minister of Outreach and Discipleship, Director of Youth & Children's Ministries, Youth & Children's Assistant, and Nursery Workers are included in this area.

#### Missions—Inreach & Outreach 9.4% (\$ 68,392.00)



The mission of Trinity UMC is "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by LOVING God and all people, by LEARNING God's will and ways, and by LIVING for Christ in the world." We provide financial support to missions and ministries within (Inreach) and outside (Outreach) our church family. Our annual apportionments support Global Church Ministries and Annual conference Ministries. We also support other ministries and missions that are close

to the heart of our church family.

#### **Facilities** 30.4% (\$ 220,763.64)

Maintaining and enjoying our beautiful church and its campus includes expenses for our building debt payment, costs for maintaining the church campus and parsonage. This section includes insurance and utilities, in addition to bus maintenance. Replacement of worn out and

outdated equipment is a priority SO we can continue to transform lives for Jesus Christ through Trinity UMC. Support for our facilities manager and sexton are included in this section.



#### Administration & Ministry Support 15.1% (\$ 110,043.14)
