Red Shoe Reflections with Rev. Kathryn

Craig and I worked together this week to replace the back brakes on my car. A mechanic I am not! Craig, on the other hand, is very mechanically minded and knows what he is doing. I kept hoping that, like Barnaby Tucker in "Hello, Dolly!" I would learn enough to get promoted from "idiot apprentice" to "incompetent clerk." Craig was a kind and patient teacher. He never made me feel bad for not knowing, but I knew enough to know I didn't know. So in addition to time with Craig, I got to learn. Brake pads, callipers, discs, etc. I knew the basics but had no real understanding of what was actually going on.



And I did learn. Craig answered all my questions. He didn't get mad at my ignorance or my occasional lapse in keeping the flashlight pointed in the right direction. Do I know more? Yes. Am I ready to do it on my own? No way!

It was easy for me to listen and learn because I had very little knowledge to start with, no place to go but up. I am not sure I always have a "listen and learn" attitude when I know something about a topic. I have looked at devotional books over the years and thought, "I don't need that, I'm past that." Maybe it's true but yet, maybe I need to stop and be open to just listening and learning. What I don't know is vastly greater than what I do know and you never know when and where you might learn something new.

Proverbs 1:5 says: "Let the wise listen to these proverbs and become even wiser. Let those with understanding receive guidance (NLT). We all have areas where we can learn more; I know I do. As we move into 2026, I want to go into the new year with an attitude of willingness to listen and learn. To hear what others can teach me and to listen again to what God is saying so that like the writer of Proverbs, I can become wise and receive guidance each and every day.

Campus/Business Report for January 2026

We begin 2026 filled with excitement, planning and celebrations surrounding the 75th Anniversary of spiritual worship at Trinity UMC. As we focus on the message of hope, generosity and peace moving forward, let's also give thanks for the blessings, spiritual growth and accomplishments of those who worshiped, staffed and served our church over the years.

As we start a new year, let's give thanks to those who serve on committees, support groups, usher & greeters, security & safety teams, soundboard, lighting & slides, teachers & aids. We value each of you for your dedication and service to our church ministry.

During the winter months, we will continue to operate our campus under energy conservation mode while observing rising fuel cost, utility use trends and weather-related adjustments for comfort. With more winter activities gearing up its even more important we follow our safety and energy saving guidelines designed to add comfort and security while avoiding wasteful utility cost.

FACILITY GUIDELINES:

- Schedule all events and facility use with the Business & Facilities Manager in advance to secure a location. Try to create a single entrance into the facility, assign a door monitor to lock doors once your event starts...especially at night.
- Reset the meeting space for the next group to use...includes all tables and chairs rearranged by your group.
- Empty all food filled trash and dispose in our dumpster located beside the bus shelter.
- Reset thermostats to non-use settings as listed.
- Check event space, classrooms & restrooms before leaving to confirm all water, lights and fans are turned off.
- Double check that all doors are locked and securely latched before leaving the buildings.
- Depart in groups or pairs if possible.
- Report immediately any safety or facility concerns to the Business & Facility Manager, Pastors or Church Staff.

What's Happening in a Glance



Hello, friends. This month, the KIDS Ministry is learning about movie making. We will create a small video and learn how to tell a story. Jesus was amazing at relating to others through parables and story telling. His style of talking to people allowed walls to come down and minds to open when giving them some tough words to hear. We should absolutely learn how to do the same. Delivery in a story is as important as the words we speak. We can choose the best words, have the best intentions, love the people we are speaking to and mean every word, but if the tone or delivery is off, those words will never get heard. Jesus was careful in how he set the scenes - there were farm lands, households, vineyards, animals, money, fishing and food - all things people could picture in the story and very common things that they could understand. Simple words helped Him deliver a powerful message. Our Sunday lessons for 2026 will include Disney movies with character traits we can spot in the stories of relatable characters who struggle with relatable obstacles. We may not be on a cliff with talking lions like Simba, but we can look at the circle of life through the garden up to the cross. We might not have twenty feet of hair like Rapunzel, but we can absolutely understand feeling trapped in a hairy situation with only a few tools around to change it for the better. We may not go To Infinity and Beyond, but Jesus for sure says You Have a Friend in Me, always. We will learn over the next twelve months how to share our story and feel a little more comfortable in our role as 'disciples making disciples' who can talk about their faith. We will start the year off with our own movie version of the Christmas story; kids are setting the scenes, creating the script and playing the parts. They are very excited and we want to tap into that excitement to show how exciting sharing our faith can be. In learning how to tell our story, we also hear our own story with our own ears. It helps us to truly own our faith, too. We can find our story in parts of other people's stories and we can absolutely find our story in Jesus' story. He is bigger than any blockbuster movie and yet, He shows up in the ordinary every day scenes of our lives. Lights, Camera.... Action!
